

February 2020 – Boerne Fire Department Monthly Report

- The Boerne Fire Department responded to 119 incidents for the month of February 2020, compared to 90 incidents in February 2019. Firefighters have responded to 233 incidents so far this year.
- Fire Department members spent a total of 190.23 man hours responding to incidents within the City limits and 344.97 man hours responding to incidents outside the City limits, for a total of 535.20 hours responding to incidents in February 2020.
- Personnel spent 33 hours attending meetings and 148.62 hours in training sessions during the month of February 2020.
- Fire Department members have spent a total of 1342.72 hours since January 1, 2020 responding to incidents, attending meetings, attending training sessions and participating in extra activities.
